\*Resolution #40-15

WHEREAS, the Bergen County Executive and the Board of Chosen Freeholders, along with the Bergen County Department of Health Services, supports the designation of Stigma-Free Zones in every municipality; and

WHEREAS, at the June 2013 meeting of the Bergen County Mental Health Board, members of the Board learned from Care Plus NJ staff that the agency was working collaboratively to establish a Stigma Free Zone in Paramus; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Mental Health Board supported the initiative and recognized that the initiative was aligned with the Board's mission to raise awareness of the disease of mental illness; and

WHEREAS, the National Institute of Mental Health reports that 1 in 4 adults experiences mental illness in a given year and 1 in 17 adults live with a serious mental illness such as schizophrenia, major depression, or bipolar disorder; approximately 20% of youth ages 13 to 18 and 13% of youth ages 8 to 15 experience severe mental disorders in a given year; and

WHEREAS, the stigma associated with the disease of mental illness is identified as the primary reason individuals fail to seek the help they need to recover from the disease; and

WHEREAS, Stigma-Free Zones aim to inspire public interest and open dialogues about stigma, raise awareness of the disease of mental illness and create a culture wherein residents who have the disease of mental illness feel supported by their community and neighbors and feel free to seek treatment for the disease without fear of stigma; and

WHEREAS, prompting awareness that there can be no "health" without mental health will break down barriers and encourage residents of all ages to be mindful of their mental health and ask for help when needed; and

WHEREAS, local resources are available to treat the disease of mental illness so no one resident needs to suffer alone or feel hopeless; and

WHEREAS, establishing Stigma-Free Zones will raise awareness of resources and encourage residents to engage in care as soon as the need is identified so recovery can begin, hope is inspired and tragedies are avoided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Upper Saddle River recognizes the community needs and supports the efforts of the County of Bergen in designating Upper Saddle River as a Stigma-Free Zone.

## \*Resolution #41-15

WHEREAS, the Borough of Upper Saddle River, New Jersey has experienced natural hazards that result in public safety hazards and damage to private and public property; and

WHEREAS, the hazard mitigation planning process set forth by the State of New Jersey and the Federal Emergency Management Agency offers the opportunity to consider natural hazards and risks, and to identify mitigation actions to reduce future risk; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management is providing federal mitigation funds to support development of the mitigation plan; and

WHEREAS, a Hazard Mitigation Plan has been developed by the Mitigation Planning Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Hazard Mitigation Plan includes a prioritized list of mitigation actions including activities that, over time, will help minimize and reduce safety threats and damage to private and public property; and

WHEREAS, the draft plan was provided to each participating jurisdiction and was posted on the County Office of Emergency Management's website so as to introduce the planning concept and to solicit questions and comments; and to present the Plan and request comments, as required by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Upper Saddle River:

- 1. The Bergen County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan, as submitted to the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management and the Federal Emergency Management Agency by the Bergen County Office of Emergency Management is hereby adopted as an official plan of the Borough of Upper Saddle River; minor revisions recommended by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and/or the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management may be incorporated without further action.
- 2. The Borough's departments identified in the Plan are hereby directed to pursue implementation of the recommended high priority activities that are assigned to their departments.
- 3. Any action proposed by the Plan shall be subject to and contingent upon budget approval, if required, which shall be at the discretion of the Governing Body, and this resolution shall not be interpreted so as to mandate any such appropriations.
- 4. The Emergency Management Coordinator is designated to coordinate with other offices and shall periodically report on the activities, accomplishments, and progress, and shall prepare an annual progress report to be submitted to the Bergen County Office of Emergency Management. The status reports shall be submitted on a yearly basis by a predetermined date as agreed upon by all stakeholders.

## \*Resolution #43-15

WHEREAS, Federal law known as the "1033 Program" allows local law enforcement agencies to obtain surplus property at little or no cost to municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Upper Saddle River Police Department is enrolled in a program established by the United States Department of Defense, pursuant to 10 U.S.C. S2576a; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to New Jersey State Statute, Chapter 23, P.L. 2015, Mayor and Council approval is required for the acquisition of federal property and subsequent transfer to local law enforcement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Upper Saddle River that it hereby approves the transfer of federal property from the US Department of Defense to the Upper Saddle River Police Department.

#### \*Resolution #44-15

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-19 provides that, where any contract, commitments or payments are to be made prior to the final adoption of the 2015 budget, temporary appropriations should be made for the purpose and the amounts required in the manner and time therein provided; and

WHEREAS, the total appropriation in the 2014 budget, exclusive of any appropriations made for interest and debt redemption charges, capital improvements fund and public assistance in said budget, is the sum of \$10,610,417.55; and

WHEREAS. One quarter of the appropriations in the 2014 budget, exclusive of any appropriations made for interest and debt redemption charges, capital improvements fund and public assistance in said budget, is the sum \$2,652,604.39.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Upper Saddle River in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey that the following appropriations be made and that a certified copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Chief Financial Officer for his records.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination, and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 thru 7.5 the Borough of Upper Saddle River has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the Borough meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2015 budget year, so now therefore;

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Upper Saddle River that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
  - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
  - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
  - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
  - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
  - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
  - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A.40A:4-45.3 et seq. are fully met (Complies with the "CAP" law.)
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C.5:30-4 and N.J.A.C.5:30-5.
- 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
  - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate, and correctly stated.
  - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth.
  - c. In itemization, form, arrangement, and content the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced, publicly advertised, and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A.~40A:4-45.3 et.seq. shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE FORWARDED TO THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES.

It is hereby certified that the Approved Budget complies with the requirements of law and approval is given pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78(b) and N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.
